**REGULATION 14(2) NOTIFICATION**

This letter is in response to your valid regulation 14(2) notification which was received on the 3<sup>rd</sup> March 2025, regarding the works listed below.

I can confirm that under Section 14(1)(c) of the Town and Country Planning (Tree Preservation) (England) Regulations 2012, you can undertake the following works listed below, because the tree(s) are considered to be in the category of 'dead and / or dangerous'.

Photographic evidence was submitted to the Council confirming works are required to make the area safe. The Council deems it necessary to not object to the works listed below, at this time.

**Proposed works to A1 of TPO 1471/2014:**

To carry out a safe, dismantle and removal of 3 dead oak trees (TG3025 & TG3036) as per Tree Survey FLAC 33-1030 Bearwood Park.

**Reasons stated for works:**

Health and safety issue.

- *The trees have all died off and as they are all along a main road, they present a danger to passing traffic and anyone passing under it. The trees have completely shut down.*

**Informative:**

- 1) You are advised that this letter is in respect of the **Tree Preservation Order only** and it does not imply that consent would be forthcoming from the owner of the tree(s) or any such other persons from whom consent would be required.
- 2) The replacement tree(s) must be of the following species and specification:
  - A minimum of 3 no. English Oak trees shall be planted to replace the trees removed as authorised by this consent.
  - Of "half standard" or "standard" size (1.8 – 3.0 metres tall) at time of planting, and to be planted as close as reasonably practical to the tree(s) removed.
  - Planted in the planting season, November to March. Container-grown trees can be planted outside this time, but do not plant in periods of drought. For both types, avoid frosty soil.
  - Planting should be carried out in accordance with clause 10 (Planting) of BS 8545:2014 'Trees: from nursery to independence in the landscape – Recommendations'.
  - Please let the Council know when the replanting has been carried out so that the Tree Officer may come and inspect the tree(s).
  - Should the replacement tree(s) be removed, die, or become severely damaged or seriously diseased, it shall be replaced by a tree of a similar size and species to that originally planted. Modifications to the requirements of this condition must be agreed in writing with Wokingham Borough Council Tree and Landscape Team.
  - PLEASE NOTE: The requirement to replant is the responsibility of the tree owner even if the application was submitted by another person.

Please note that your attention is drawn to the following information:

### **Bird Nesting Season and Presence of Bat Roosts**

In accordance with the Wildlife and Countryside Act (1981) and Countryside Rights of Way Act (2000), consideration must be given to the timing and type of tree work operations, to avoid causing disturbance to any nesting birds or bat roosts that may be present within the tree(s).

The Act makes it an offence (subject to exceptions) to intentionally kill, injure, or take, possess, or trade in any wild animal listed, and prohibits interference with places used for shelter or protection, or intentionally disturbing animals occupying such places.

It is advised that all non-urgent major tree work and hedge cutting operations are undertaken at a time to avoid disturbing nesting birds during the breeding season (to which the bird nesting season is considered to be from March to July). Where bats are suspected to be present, it is recommended that advice first be sought from a licenced bat specialist and if appropriate, the relevant licence(s) be obtained before any major tree work or hedge cutting commences.

### **Forestry Act 1967 and Felling Licences**

If it proposed to fell a tree or trees greater than 5 cubic metres or sell more than 2 cubic metres of timber in any calendar quarter, a Felling Licence from the Forestry Authority may be required.

Please note that Felling Licences are not required to remove trees from domestic (residential) gardens. Where you are the landowner of large pieces of land with numerous trees, clarification from the Forestry Commission may be required as to whether a Felling licence is needed.
